Course Description: Assistant Instructor is a course for those who wish to assist in teaching scuba dive with an opportunity to obtain certification.

Prerequisites: 1. Master Diver Certification
2. 18 Years or older

Course Goals: The Assistant Instructor course will begin teaching the Master Divers how to teach Scuba Diving to new SCUBA Divers. In addition the students will be taught how to handle Emergency situations and how to schedule and manage a Dive Site for new SCUBA Divers.

Grading:

Homework represents 30% of your grade and is determined by the completion of the required workbook.

Quizzes represent 20% of the total grade and include; five in-class, multiple choice, quizzes, and two written take-home quizzes. The take-home quizzes are located in the back of the workbook.

Lab and Lecture Attendance represent 25% of your grade. Students are not permitted to miss any classes. In the event your scheduled class must be missed you must attend another section later in the week. All missed classes must be made-up. Make-ups can be coordinated with the instructor.

The Assistant Instructor, First Aid/CPR/O2 Provider, Rescue Diver Final Exams together represent the remaining 25% of your grade. Each final exam is a 50 question, comprehensive, multiple choice, test.
